## Peace is the future: Religions and Cultures in Dialogue -100 Years after World War I - Extract from Proclamation of Appeal for Peace 2014, 9 September 2014, Antwerp:

"Today we assume responsibility for peace, in a time when few people dream of peace.

The world religions affirm, stronger than before, that no war is ever holy, that the elimination of the other in God's name is always blasphemy. The elimination of the other exploiting God's name is only horror and terror. It sets people outside authentic religion, blinded by hatred, and destroys the religion they claim to defend.

In difficult times, we commit ourselves to defending the lives of those brothers and sisters of religions different from our own who are endangered.

Let us work together for the future of the world, aware that war is a great foolishness and peace is something too serious to make it the affair of a few. Dialogue is the cure for conflicts; it heals wounds and makes the future possible. "

# Global Church groups agree to confront Christian discrimination, persecution and martyrdom together

A meeting convened by the <u>Global Christian Forum</u> in Strasbourg, France, including representatives from the <u>Vatican</u>, the <u>World Council of Churches</u>, the <u>World Evangelical</u> <u>Alliance</u> and the <u>Pentecostal World Fellowship</u>, agreed on 9 September to press ahead with a global gathering on the issue of 'Christian discrimination, persecution and martyrdom' for late 2015. ....

Rev Dr. Hielke Wolters, Associate General Secretary of the World Council of Churches said, "It is a strong sign of hope that churches and ecumenical organisations with such a diverse background are ready to work together to support Christians that go through difficult times. Religious freedom is important for all of us, whether Christian, Muslim or adherent of any other religion.

"This joint initiative is very much in line with the WCC's efforts to accompany Christians and churches in countries like Syria, Iraq, Egypt and Nigeria.
