We look out at a world full of tears, recognising our many blessings here in Australia. Can we lift our vision and display together the kind of change of heart needed by the whole human family? Away from violence and division towards peace and with justice for all

Can the Prime Minister and Leader of the Opposition meet privately, perhaps with the Governor-General, to sort out a solution to the issue of Nauru and Manus Island Detention Centres? This matter tears at the national soul.
